#### Sir/Madam,

- 1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Late Kedari Redekar Ayurvedic Mahavidyalaya Gadhinglaj P-2 ,MIDC artea, Shendri Mal Dist- Kolhapur-416502Maharashtra (AYU0182) inspection was conducted on 03.04.2025 and 04.04.2025 on Hybrid mode by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM for issuance of Extended permission with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 51 seats in 08 PG Courses in the subjects namely: (i) Shalya Tantra- 12 seats, (ii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan 04 seats, (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisjya Kalpana- 05 seats, (iv) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga- 06 seats, (v) Kaumarbhritya 06 seats, (vi) Shalakya Tantra 06 seats, (vii) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats, (viii) Panchkarma- 06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder and the discrepanicies were found in respect of AEBAS report. Accordingly clarification letter was sent to youvide letter of even no. dated 13.05.2025. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide letter dated 16.05.2025.
- 3. Accordingly, the assessment report along with the new AEBAS report and the clarification was placed in the 132<sup>nd</sup>
  Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 09.07.2025
  On careful examination of the assessment report, Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to the college and same was communicated to you vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 05.08.2025 to appear on 08.08.2025 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission to your college be denied for the academic session 2025-26
- 4. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated in the hearing letter. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter. No LKRSS/AMCG/WS-3/494/174/2025 dated 07.08.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives Hearing was attended by Dr.Shivani gavande, Principal of the college appeared before the Hearing Committee on 08.08.2025 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Bio Metricattendance with AEBAS, we want to clarify some points, as follows.

1. After receiving show cause notice on 14/05/2025, we submitted ourclarification on 16/05/2025.

Following difficulties we faced during period of 12<sup>th</sup>March 2025 to16/05/2025 were as follows,

- a. ADHAAR identification errors.
- **b**. Connectivity problems with machine.
- c. Due to loss of electricity, device shut down & server congestion. With repeated telephonic conversation & mail, we tried our best to sort out technical issues. Meanwhile we have submitted number ofcomplaints to service provider. After complaints the servicing authority sent us technician for repairing the instruments. On22/07 /2025 report says that

authority sent us technician for On22/07 /2025 report says that Iris RD service reinstalled andconfigured. Some of our faculties face the problems related "showingcapture error" & "Pending downloads" while Iris recognition through AEBAS. The related documents are attached with thisletter & problem was informed to service provider. After compliant, the service provider again reported on02/08/2005 device firmware was corrupted and power adapter waschanged on the same day, Related documents are attached

- with this letter. **d**. Since college is situated in Rural & Hilly area, there is o proper mobile network of any service provider.
- e. College is situated 5 km away from city in MIDC area where we face regular problem with electricity.
- ii) During the month of April, May & June the number of our teachers were allotted NCISM Visitation confidential work & university duties like ...
- a. Practical examiners,b. Local Inspection Committee(LIC) for assessment of colleges.
- iii) We had university vacation with duration 30/04/2025 to 08/06/2025.

  Among this schedule, half of faculty members were an official sanctioned vacation leaves, as per university guidelines. So these vacation days can be reduced from total working days.
- iv)Dr. PrajaktaAmitPundpal is joined on I " August 2025. So her attendance should be considered from I " August 2025 i.e. only 3 days instead of 103 days.

major concerned. The principal sustained the major points of their reply letter dated 07.08.2025 which are mentioned as under:-

- Machine
   encountered
   various problems
  like
- a. Adhaar identification
- Connectivity problem
- c. Power supply issues
- d. Problem with server
- e. Data corruption in the machine.

Majority of faculty faced issues like machine showing and capture error pending downloads. As a result the machine was inspected and reconfigured. To counter check this issue a few faculty members were randomly called upon the committee members and asked to mark their attendance in front of camera installed in the college premises. No problem of machine error was encountered and machine was found to he working satisfactory.

- ii) Another reasons for low attendance submitted by the principal like:-
- Deputation of faculty members on official duties of NCISM/LIC for assessment of colleges.
- Half of faculty members going on university vacation from 30.04.2025 to 08.06.2025.
- 1 candidate resigned, another candidate going abroad and 1 female candidate being on maternity leaves.

However, the committee members were not fully satisfied and instead of individual reasons the for low attendance of majority the staff was questioned upon.

- vi) Dr. AsmitaDeotale was maternity leave from 1st December 2024 to so" June 2025 for seven months as per her request.
- vii) Dr. VijayalakshmiPatil (Chindak) is on long leave and went abroad from 1st June 2025 to i" October 2025. So please consider her leave.
- viii) Evidence of CCTV footage is uploaded on mail drive of mail Id lkrbams@gmail.com for your reference.
- ix)We are attaching leave applications and related documents of leaves alsothe MUHS university vacation schedule along with this letter. So considering all above points, we are submitting you the detaileddata in excel format with related document of regarding the queries. We value the integrity of attendance managements system we humbly request you to consider our clarification & grand usconditional permission & opportunity to continue serving the society through bright doctor students with diligence and accountability. Sorry for inconvenience & thank you for your understanding. Kindly find the related attachment

The principal in her last attempt to justify the deficiencies tried to establish that the total number of working days arrived upon by the NCISM i.e. 103 working days is incorrect and should exclude the actual days of university vacation and duty leaves.

The principal finally resubmitted that:-

- The machine is fully functional now and working properly under CCTV surveillance which was found to be correct and is affirmed by the committee members
- The information pertaining official vacation and leaves shall be reported to NCISM in advance by the college authorities so as to arrive at actual working days prior to any further visits by the NCISM. She also submitted to send the relevant documents to the substantiate clarifications. The committee rely members upon the submissions made.

Hence, in view of the facts mentioned above, final decision rests with higher authorities.

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- 5. Accordingly, the assessment report was duly placed in the 140<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 12.08.2025 and Board observed that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of extended permission as per the Concerned Acts Regulations. Hence, the Board decided to issue extended permission in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 in UG (BAMS) course and in accordance with Regulation 15 (5) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 in 08 PG Courses under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 along with a condition to comply with the guideline issued with regard to AEBAS.
- 6. Further, the Board had issued letter with regard to bifurcation of Shalakya PG program into Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) & Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino-Laryngology) as per sub regulation no. 3 of the Regulation 04 of MESA&R PG Ayurveda Regulation 2024, respectively to which the college had submitted their compliance vide an email dated 13.08.2025 and for 06 seats of Shalakya Tantra you have opted for Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa-03 seats and Shalakya-Karna, Mukha & Nasa Roga Chikitsa-03 seats.

### "DECISION"

- 7. Therefore, Late Kedari Redekar Ayurvedic Mahavidyalaya Gadhinglaj P-2, MIDC artea, Shendri Mal Dist-Kolhapur-416502Maharashtra (AYU0182) is hereby granted with Extended permission in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and in accordance with Regulation 15 (5) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 With 51 seats in 08 PG Courses in the subjects namely (i) Shalya Tantra- 12 seats, (ii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan 04 seats, (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisjya Kalpana- 05 seats, (iv) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga- 06 seats, (v) Kaumarbhritya 06 seats, (vi) Shalakya Tantra 06 seats (Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa-03 seats and Shalakya- Karna, Mukha & Nasa Roga Chikitsa-03 seats), (vii) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats, (viii) Panchkarma-06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 along with a condition to comply with the guideline issued with regard to AEBAS and subject to the condition that the following conditions shall be fulfilled:-
- I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats in UG and 51 seats in 08 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the

remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
  - 8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
  - 9. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
  - 10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
  - 11. Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
  - 12. The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st DEcember, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
  - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled,
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024,
  - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of postgraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
  - v) The remaining visitation fee as communicated in the letter dated 28.01.2025.
  - 13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
